

Ballot Proofing Checklist

QUESTIONS TO ASK WHEN PROOFING BALLOTS:

Does my candidate's name appear with the correct spelling in every county? The official forms you have submitted, such as a Declaration of Candidacy, typically determine the spelling of your candidate's name on the ballot. Make sure the name matches.

Do the contests and candidates appear in the right order? Check state law to verify the order of both the offices and the names on the ballot

Are there any contests in the same column as the instructions? Voters often skip contests when they are buried below a lengthy set of instructions. Confirm that no contests appear in the same column as the instructions.

Are there any contests that span more than one column? All of the candidates for a particular office should appear in the same column. Confirm that no contest is split across multiple columns.

Are multiple contests appearing on the same electronic voting screen? If you are able to proof electronic ballot versions, ensure that there is one contest per screen.

Is there more than one language and are any translations accurate? A ballot with more than two languages can be confusing. Ensure that no more than two languages appear on the same ballot and confirm that all translations are accurate.

Is anything else on the ballot confusing? Every ballot presents its own issues and it's easy to miss a problem if you've been staring at the ballot for long enough. Before completing your review, ask a fellow staffer to review and assess if there are any other concerns.
